# "I am the Light of the World"

## **Resources for Preparation beforehand:**

- ➤ Who is Jesus/Who am I sheet
- A candle
- A means of playing the worship song and/or copies of words for everyone

#### **Discussion Starter:**

What kind of light appeals to you and why? (desk light, torch, bonfire, spotlight, sunset etc)

#### **God Reveals Himself:**

Light is so important to us all. In Genesis 1: 1-5 in the creation story the first part of creation is the light. On the following days we are told of lots of different things appeared. Why was day 1 only about the creation of light?

# **Experiential exploration of the flame:**

Light the candle and place it where everyone can see it, encourage people to look closely at the flame and appreciate it. This is a reflective exercise.

Reading: John 8 v 12-20

#### **Questions:**

- 1. If you connected with one of the services what did you take away?
- 2. Why do you think the Pharisees were particularly upset when Jesus claimed to be the Light of the World? (Is 42 v 6, Is 60 v 1-3)
- 3. What aspect of light do you think John is describing?
- 4. In what way have you seen Jesus as a light in a dark place recently?

# Imagine a torchlight walk (Reflective):

You are out in the late evening and there is darkness all around you. You have a torch which you switch on as you begin to walk. Consider what you can see and what is left unseen.

- 5. Where is there darkness in your community?
- 6. How might Jesus shine in your community?

# Response & Worship:

**Song suggestion: "Light of the World"** (Chris Tomlin version of Tim Hughes lyrics Look at the candle again can you make out different things? (may be turn off the electric lights if they are on): for reflection and prayer

### Take Away:

- Encourage everyone to record something on their "Who is Jesus/Who am I" sheet and bring it to add to each week.
- For during the week:
  - Try having a candle burning when you have your quiet time
  - Be aware of the different types of light you experience throughout the week
  - o Read Ps 119 v 105 and reflect on it
  - Why not see whether your elderly neighbours have torches that work.
